### \$215M Improvements on S.R. 189 Needed from Mariposa POE to I-19

By Eric Jay Toll for Arizona Builder's Exchange ADOT calls "necessary" a \$215M project improving S.R. 189 from the Mariposa Port-of-Entry to I-19. The agency is kicking off projects this fall to alleviate some of the congestion on the short stretch of road.


The newly improved—and busiest border crossing between the U.S. and Mexico handles up to 2,000 trucks per day. The number of trucks is expected to jump to 3,000 per day next year when the port is fully operational. Already the nearly fourmile stretch of S.R. 189 between the border and I-19 is heavily congested. Increasing trucks by another 50 percent will create a greater problem.

Depending on the improvements selected, S.R. 189 could cost as little as \$50M or as much as \$215M. The variance comes from a simple widening and cutback on intersections along the existing route or building the stretch to parkway or freeway standards. A final decision can't be made until there's money in the pot for the road improvements. There are no funds yet identified for the 3.75 mile project. ADOT is looking towards federal, state and P3 (public-private partnerships) as possible sources for the logistics effort.

Last week ADOT started a \$1.5M intelligent traffic signal installation interconnecting signals via microwave. The ITS system links signals to real time traffic flow. Traffic light timing varies with actual traffic volume and speed approaching intersections. The continuous

> adaptation will help traffic flow more smoothly.

At the intersection of Mariposa Road (S.R. 189) and I-19, additional left turn lanes are being added on the departure side of the intersection. The work on this project is to be completed by the end of 2013.

### **Phoenix Looks to Revamp Central Station, Explores Potential Of Multi-Use Building**

Phoenix officials are seeking approval to ask real estate developers for ideas to transform Valley Metro's Central Station, Central Avenue and Van Buren Street, Downtown Phoenix. They hope to develop a multi-use building while still maintaining the station's function as a transportation center for the community.

The city will request an open call to developers around the nation to pitch ideas on what to do with the space.

In an Oct. 8 meeting, the Phoenix City Council Transportation and Infrastructure Subcommittee approved the decision to issue the request for the changes to Central Station and sent it to the city council for November 6.

The city is looking for a multi-purpose building to be built on the property, but the station must still keep the functions of a transit center. The city also wants to keep the buses and light rail operating from the location.

Ultimately, how the space will be used depends on what developers suggest, said Maria Hyatt, interim public transit director. She said the maintenance and security for the property would be provided by the developer.

The only requirement the city is looking for is to maintain the transit uses the station has, Hyatt said.

Economic Development Program Manager Eric Johnson said, "This is an excellent opportunity for us to do a transitoriented development project."

The city was approached about the property by a developer, which is why the city is asking to issue a request for proposals, Hyatt said. She said the name of the developer would not be released for fair competition.

If City Council approves the request for proposals, the city will advertise the request and they will let developers respond for 45 to 50 days. A proposal would be chosen in early 2014.

### New 10KSF Building on the Horizon for Yuma Crisis Center

By Mara Knaub for Yuma Sun Amberly's Place continues to see a growing need for its services. With the number of abuse cases increasing yearly, the emergency shelter has outgrown its current 4.5KSF.

Now this dream of a new building – which once seemed distant – is becoming a reality.

At the center's 12th anniversary gala October 11, it was announced that the center will be moving into a new space large enough to allow staff to provide confidential services to multiple victims and their families at one time.

The new building, located at 1310 S. 3rd Ave., Yuma, between the municipal and superior courts, is 10.4KSF. It is large enough to house four playrooms, four family rooms, two medical rooms and a medical suite for forensic specialists to meet privately with victims.

It will also provide a large pantry for emergency food and donated quilts and hygiene items.

The new building will have offices for all six crisis response advocates and two forensic interviewers and four interview rooms with conference rooms nearby.

Offices are also being designed for a therapist who can assist victims on-site as well as offices for administrative staff and community training staff.

A capital campaign will start next month that will give community members an opportunity to partner with Amberly's Place on this new building.

The center serves an average of 185 to 200 people a month.

### Alliance Residential Buys Out Triyar's Interest in Industry Apartments in Scottsdale

Just south of where the Arizona Canal crosses Scottsdale and Camelback roads, Alliance Residential picked up 5.4 acres from Triyar Capital for a 316 unit, \$70M apartment complex. A year-end groundbreaking, with **Alliance** 

acting as its own GC, is expected before the end of the year.

Alliance will pay Triyar \$18.5M (\$343K/acre) for the project site—a pair of parcels previously approved for The Industry East and West apartments. Designed by the **Office of Rich Barber**, the pair of buildings will be located at 75<sup>th</sup> St. and Stetson Dr., Scottsdale.

Triyar originally submitted the application package last year, with Alliance identified as a partner in the project. If all goes as plans, Alliance closes today. The east building on 3.1 acres will have 183 apartments, and the west building will have 133 on its 2.3 acres.

With its recent acquisition of The Galleria at Fifth Ave. and Scottsdale Rd., Triyar, according to <u>Business Real</u> <u>Estate Weekly</u> of Arizona, has assembled nearly all of the land southeast of the canal and west of 75<sup>th</sup> Street, and controls its further sale, leasing or use.



#### **Vacancies Up as Apartment Construction Surges**

By Kristena Hansen for Phoenix Business Journal Wood Partners' \$38M luxury apartment project slated for downtown Scottsdale will add to the glut of new multifamily projects going up across metro Phoenix, especially in Scottsdale.

With this increase in supply, Valley apartment vacancies are starting to flatten out -- and even increase in some markets, such as south Scottsdale -- and the uptick in rental rates is slowing, according to Hendricks Berkadia's third-quarter multifamily report.

Construction has wrapped up on more than 1,500 multifamily units so far this year, and about one-third of those were completed during the third quarter, the report said. The bulk of these new deliveries are taking place in Scottsdale, Chandler and Gilbert. By the end of next year, Hendricks Berkadia estimates more than 5,400 units will be finished valleywide, 68 percent more than last year.

This supply surge caused the valleywide apartment vacancy rate to increase slightly, from 6.3 percent at the end of June to 6.8 percent by the end of September; lower than last year's 7.1 percent.

Vacancies for luxury apartments, such as the one Wood Partners is building, saw the biggest quarterover-quarter jump: from 6.5 percent to 7.3 percent.

# Hillstone Replaces Houston's at Hilton Village

Its parent company plans to completely renovate the 6KSF Hilton Village Houston's into its new theme, Hillstone. Plans are in front of the Scottsdale development review board for public comment. A hearing date has not been set.

The last Phoenix area Houston's, 6113 N. Scottsdale Rd., is planned to close and reopen under a new banner in a major renovation of the old restaurant. Designed for the Scottsdale resort district by **stenforSIAssociates**, Los Angeles, the application calls out a reconstruction into a "sleeker" building.

A significant open area for outdoor dining is being added to the restaurant as part of an improved pedestrian experience for the stand-alone building fronting Scottsdale Road. The architects say that the new design is more open than the current facility. "Transparent," is the term used in the application.

No GC has been selected, and Hillstone hopes to break ground in second quarter 2014.

### Arizona Net Metering Likely at ACC in November

You're probably going to have to wait a month.

ACC Commissioner Susan Bitter Smith said October 8 that discussion likely won't take place until November.

The net metering debate is one where, again, all eyes are on the state. Not that it's a bad thing or a good thing. It's just a thing in this case.

The big fight started last year, when ACC staff issued a recommendation that APS should do more to encourage rooftop solar because it was more efficient than utility-scale solar.

So now it comes down to the ACC, and it comes down to some November meetings where all eyes in the solar industry will be on Arizona.

#### **SRP Needs More Time for GRIC X-Mission Route**

By Eric Jay Toll for Arizona Builder's Exchange Changing its route through Gila River Indian Community lands, SRP is pushing back its schedule for a 230kV transmission line. Responding to public pressure about the original route through Sun Lakes, the public power provider wants to take an extra eight months to negotiate and study a route using GRIC property.

Culminating a year of discussions, community and SRP officials have agreed upon a potential route on Native American lands. Chandler city officials have also been involved in the process to find a way to provide additional power into the Price Corridor. Expansion of existing businesses, such as Intel and Wells Fargo, combined with GM Innovation and other anticipated new business in the area have prompted the requirement for additional power supplies to south Chandler.

The additional time will be used for environmental and demand studies in order to obtain approval from the Arizona Power Plant and Transmission Line Siting Committee. Final approval rests with the Arizona Corporation Commission late next year.



### Southern Arizona Economic Development Groups Win \$475K Grant

By Joyce Lobeck for Yuma Sun The Yuma-area's efforts to create more jobs is getting help through a half-million-dollar federal grant awarded to a regional collaboration to develop a strategic plan for manufacturing in Southern Arizona and New Mexico.

The collaboration, Innovation Frontier Southwest, has been awarded a \$457K grant by the U.S. Department of Commerce Economic Development Administration. The grant is designed as a series of targeted studies that will allow the border region to determine current assets and deficits in infrastructure, workforce, research and policy. Innovation Frontier Southwest is a collaboration of Tech Parks Arizona, the University of Arizona's technology-parks arm; Pima County; the Arizona Commerce Authority; the city of Tucson; the Greater Yuma Economic Development Corp.; Tucson Regional Economic Opportunities Inc.; and two agencies in New Mexico.

Although most of the grant activity will be in Tucson, GYEDC will help with the initial development of the data and "hopefully reap the benefits of the assets," said Julie Engel, president and chief executive officer of the Yuma organization.

Greater Yuma

It complements a \$140K grant that Yuma County and GYEDC received through the same program. That grant, announced in late September, will fund a study to identify barriers to attracting manufacturers to the Yuma area, Engel said.

The grants will help communities undertake the strategic planning necessary to compete for the IMCP Challenge being launched this fall and awarded in the spring.

In the 2014 Challenge competition, the administration will designate standout "manufacturing communities" and give them an advantage in securing grants and investments through programs offered by 10 federal departments and agencies across the government.

### Wickenburg Annexation Plan Could Double Size of Town

By Jen Lebron for The Arizona Republic The quiet, cowboy town of Wickenburg could one day double its population if it annexes 2,186 acres slated for development.

The town of 6,500 has been working with property owner M3 Companies for about two years on an annexation plan that would add a master-planned community with up to 3,129 new housing units. The Yavapai County Board of Supervisors already has approved the development, which is on county land.

"The question isn't whether or not the development should be built, but whether or not it should be in Wickenburg," Town Manager Josh Wright said. "The choice the council will need to make is if they want to have control and a say in a development that's a stone's throw away."

If the 3.4-square-mile area near U.S. 93 and S.R. 89 interchange becomes part of Wickenburg it will be the largest chunk of land ever annexed by the town and the decision would have major implications for the town's future, Wright said.

The annexed land would place Wickenburg closer to the proposed but unfunded Interstate 11 (AZBEX update: Proposed Alternative H will pass by Wickenburg; a final alignment for I-11 has not been selected. See story, October 11, 2013)


Yavapai County in 2007 approved M3's plans to build homes on the property. Homes in the first phase, called Wickenburg Ranch, are expected to be sold beginning in late 2014, according to Bill Brownlee, a partner at M3.

The area is also zoned for commercial development and the company will work to attract businesses such as a grocery store, Brownlee said.

Although some Town Council members support annexation, some residents oppose it, including two of the eight property owners.

The Town Council is expected to vote on the annexation November 4.



### Scottsdale Seeks Voter OK for \$212M in Bond Projects

By Eric Jay Toll for Arizona Builder's Exchange Four bond questions totaling \$212.1M are on the ballot next month for Scottsdale voters action. The bonds cover nearly 40 projects divided into four groups. Transportation, streets and trail projects will total \$99M for 19 projects, if okayed by voters November 5. The neighborhood flood control's bond asks \$19M for five projects and public safety has another ten projects totaling \$43.7M. Parks, libraries and community facilities, put ten projects on the ballot with a total value of \$50.4M.

#### Scottsdale's Bond Projects



#### **Transportation, Streets, Trails**

The key capital project is a new downtown Scottsdale parking garage for 400 vehicles in the Old Town area. The project, if approved, will go in the area bounded by Camelback, Indian School and Miller roads and Drinkwater Blvd. The multistory facility is needed to meet parking needs for new downtown area employers.

Traffic signals will be upgraded throughout the city – including freeway interchanges – as Scottsdale starts moving towards an intelligent traffic signal system. ITS traffic lights are integrated with battery backups and an ability to adapt timing to real time traffic data. The improvements are expected to ease congestion and smooth traffic flow.

The largest portion of the bond goes towards funding associated with improvements at Loop 101 and Bell Road, Pima Road/Princess Drive, and Frank Lloyd Wright Boulevard. The city intends to resolve congestion and capacity with the current road system.

The street operations department is looking to buy three acres and build a maintenance and staging facility.

#### **Neighborhood Flood Control**

Five projects will manage flood water in several neighborhoods throughout the city. The largest project is the \$46.7M Granite Reef watershed. Scottsdale's share is \$8.8M. Maricopa County and the Salt River Pima Indian Community are putting up \$23.7M and \$14.2M respectively.

#### **Public Safety**

Five public safety buildings will be upgraded or expanded if the bond issue passes. Part of the money goes to building a permanent 10KSF Desert Foothills fire station. Fire training, Via Linda facility, and two fire stations will be expanded with the money.

#### Parks, Libraries, Community Facilities

The Civic Center library improvements will be completed, along with an enhanced west entrance to the Civic Center area. Expansions are tagged for the Via Linda and Granite Reef Senior Centers. The final phase of improvements to the Scottsdale Center for the Performing Arts is also part of the bond.

### **Loss of Commercial Land Dismays Gilbert Chamber**

By Parker Leavitt for The Arizona Republic As residential developers chip away at the amount of vacant real estate in Gilbert zoned for commercial use, the Gilbert Chamber of Commerce is calling on town officials to halt all such zoning changes to further study their impact.

#### **Gilbert Commercial to Residential Conversions**

- Location: McQueen and Warner roads
- Zoning impact: Loss of 13 acres of commercial.

- Zoning impact: Loss of 14 acres of commercial.
- Status: Approved June 6.

The chamber's board of directors on Sept. 24 issued a letter to Town Council members expressing concern that the loss of commercial zoning could leave neighborhoods "without vital retail or employment services" while Gilbert loses tax revenue to adjacent communities.

Over the past four months, developers have submitted five rezoning requests to shift nearly 50 acres of commercial land to residential. Four zoning cases have been approved, while one other is pending.

As the economy begins to recover, owners of long-vacant commercial properties are looking for opportunities to reduce risk and recover remaining equity from their investments, chamber officials said.

Since residential markets typically recover before commercial markets, developers want to build homes on prime sites that are often commercially zoned for retail, office or industrial uses, the letter says.

"We're seeing some activity, and that's good," Tilque said. "We're still seeing a lot of uncertainty. To make decisions because of a quick market shift in the recession has long-term implications."

Land designated for employment centers brings in taxes and jobs, which are important for a community's long-term sustainability, Tilque said. "What are we going to do when we run out of land and the opportunity to build it out?" she asked. "Who's going to pay the freight after that point?"

For now, the town will continue to review zoning applications on their "own merits" rather than impose a moratorium, officials said.

### Alhambra Elementary Seeks \$5M for Renovation, Buses, Technology

By Eric Jay Toll for Arizona Builder's Exchange If voters approve a capital bond request from the Alhambra Elementary School District, about half the money will go towards safety and modernization improvements in the district's schools and offices. The money is earmarked to upgrade aging buildings and put an emphasis on safety and efficiency of buildings.

The balance of the \$5M request goes towards school buses and technology purchases for the district schools. The district hopes to use the renovations to improve the classroom environments and increase success opportunities for students. Some of the money will also be targeted towards building maintenance. Budget cuts by the legislature in recent years significantly slashed money for school buildings and maintenance.

The district said it lost more than \$25M in money that could have been spent on capital projects over the past five years and had to use money for operational purchases, such as textbooks and furniture.



#### **Tucson Rio Nuevo Investigation Shows Mismanagement, No Criminal Charges**

By Darren DaRonco The Rio Nuevo debacle may have squandered millions of dollars in taxpayer money, but no one will wind up behind bars because of it.

> The Arizona Attorney General's Office released a memo outlining its decision to decline prosecuting anyone for the nearly decadelong exercise in government mismanagement.

> Many Rio Nuevo critics held out hope the attorney general's and FBI's investigations would bring charges against those responsible for wasting approximately \$250M and eroding Tucson's trust in government.

#### **December 2012 Memo States Reasons**

But the memo, which was dated December 2012 but didn't become public until late Thursday, dashed those hopes.

Even though the 18-month investigation uncovered "ample evidence" the city, Rio Nuevo board members and others botched the project from almost start to finish, the bumbling didn't rise to the criminal level, it said.

Some of the charges the two agencies investigated included ghost vendors, overbilling, conflicts of interest, bribes and kickbacks. But he said the passage of time between the alleged crimes and the investigation posed significant obstacles.


Further, information provided by the two former board members who filed the complaint was oftentimes inaccurate or unreliable, the memo said.

The memo concluded by stating that unless new evidence surfaced, the only option left was to close the investigation.

#### **Tucson officials concur**

"Many of us have been saying all along that there's a fundamental and legal difference between gross financial mismanagement and criminal wrongdoing," Councilman Steve Kozachik said. The city and the former Rio board were guilty of the former... Now the attorney general is finally conceding that there were no criminal smoking guns. Hopefully, now we can get focused on managing and investing the taxpayers' money the way it always should have been and put the witch hunt to bed."

### **Plans for Casa Grande Station II are Moving Forward**

By Melissa St. Aude for Casa Grande Dispatch Although development plans for 34 acres behind the old outlet center on Jimmie Kerr Boulevard have twice been rejected by Casa Grande planning staff, company officials with AZ Outlet Investments, sister company to PhoenixMart, believe their revised concept will meet with city approval.

Original plans for the development, known as "Station II," called for several urban-style structures including a 165foot high-rise apartment building, 110-foot hotel along with a six-level parking garage, four-story anchor store, single retail store and additional buildings with heights up to 75 feet.


In rejecting the development plans, Casa Grande Planning and Development staff in reports said the project was not compatible with the surrounding area and that setbacks did not conform with city code.

A redesign of the plan has addressed some of the height and density issues, AZ Outlet CEO Schoenfelder said, and one of the larger buildings in the development could be redesigned as two.

AZ Outlet Investments also owns the outlet mall on Tanger Drive, which it re-branded as Home Center Factory Direct, with a focus on home-related products and services.

The two properties are designed to work together, according to Schoenfelder.

# Pinal County Road Widening Project Delayed by D.C. Shutdown

Pinal County Supervisor Anthony Smith met with Arizona City residents October 1 to talk about a variety of issues in Pinal County District 3. A pair of [infrastructure] projects topped the agenda:

#### Flood Mitigation Project Under Way

The flood mitigation plan is well under way with the county having purchased the land near Battaglia Drive and Henness Road last August. Smith said that engineering firm Ritoch-Powell is working on its submittal packet and that as of Oct. 1 all utility companies have agreed to move their lines/infrastructure. Work on the flood mitigation plan is scheduled to commence by the end of 2013.

#### **Battaglia Drive Widening**

Smith gave an update to the Battaglia Drive widening project saying it was on schedule and bid openings were set for Oct. 14. The Supervisor anticipated that the addition of left turn lanes would begin 45 days after that.

Then later last week, Pinal County received information from one of the prospective bidders that they have been unable to get a bid bond from the Small Business Administration to allow them to bid the project because of the government shutdown.

To ensure that all prospective bidders have equal consideration and to allow time for companies to consider alternate methods for obtaining a bid bond, an addendum was issued announcing that the

bid opening will be delayed until at least November 7, 2013.

"This is a high priority project for Arizona City," Supervisor Smith said in an e-mail to [the Arizona City Independent], "It is unfortunate that the delay has occurred. However, we will continue to move as quickly as possible to make sure there are no additional delays."

#### **Grand Canyon Trust, 16 Others Win Environmental Awards**

By Eric Jay Toll for Arizona Builder's Exchange Grand Canyon Trust Volunteer Program was best of show, and 16 other winners walked away with Valley Forward's Environmental Excellence Awards for 2013. The Arizona Forward-SRP award partnership recognizes projects environmental contributions and sustainability. Another 33 projects won awards of merit.

More than 110 entries were reviewed for the awards, with the Grand Canyon Trust Volunteer Program receiving the coveted President's Award for its stewardship efforts. The program embraces more than 3,000 individuals volunteering over 18,000 hours a year to science-based conservation projects. The program also won a first-place Crescordia Award in the Environmental Stewardship—Northern Arizona category.

Only three projects received awards in multiple categories this year. One was the DARTS building, originally constructed in 1969 and completely renovated by Gabor Lorant Architects with modern enhancements and sustainable features. The building itself won a first-place Crescordia award in the Buildings and Structures - Commercial & Mixed Use category and the updated landscaping features received an Award of Merit in the Site Development and Landscape - Private Sector category.

Double honors also went to Gordon Estates, a subdivision by Mandalay Homes constructed through Phoenix's Neighborhood Stabilization Program. This vacant, foreclosed subdivision in south Phoenix was completely renovated to erase neighborhood blight and is now the most highly rated and certified green subdivision in the country. Its affordable homes boast an average estimated electric bill of \$50 per month. The Phoenix program won a first-place in the Livable Communities -Sustainable Communities category and the subdivision earned an Award of Merit in Buildings and Structures – Residential.

PHX Sky Train also won multiple awards, a Crescordia in Livable Communities – Multi Modal Transportation & Connectivity for its stature as the only LEED Gold certified transit campus in the world and merit recognition for Art in Public Places.

#### **Dedicated Fans and Design Buffs Await Camelview Theater Fate**

Compiled by Eric Jay Toll for AZBEX It's not the place fans line up for days for the latest Batman or Hunger Games. It's five screens with a steady stream of film buffs seeking films off the mainstream of commercial releases. Harkins' Camelview Theater, on the north side of Fashion Square is a theater-at-risk.

#### **Camelview on Valuable Ground**

Specializing in art and independent films, the Camelview sits on premium real estate adjoining Goldwater Blvd. and Highland Ave. "We don't own the land or the building," Harkins vice president of marketing Ann Silsby says. "Harkins is dedicating to ensuring that there will be theaters showing these films." She says it's not the theater's decision whether the Camelview stays or goes.

In a pair of articles in Phoenix Business Journal premium content, reporter Kristena Hansen explores how real estate and the 56KSF expansion of Fashion Square will dictate the whether Camelview goes dark. Despite the technology upgrades to digital inside, the theater's interior seating and amenities have not been updated in years. Local real estate expert Pete Bolton told Hansen the physical facility "is a dinosaur."


Ironically, over at the Stray Cat Theater in Tempe, Annie Baker's play, "The Flick" carries an understory of the demise of a small independent theater and its conversion to group ownership and digital presentations. The message flowing below the main plot is the plight of the small movie house.

#### **Small Screens Suffer from Digital Cost**

In Hansen's other article, the cost of going digital and competing against megaplexes is pushing small theater operators to adapt or die.

Michael Pollack, owner of \$3/ticket Pollack Cinema says he can't make money with six screens and the cost of a digital conversion—and he owns his own buildings. Other independents talked with Hansen about the challenges and the cost. Hansen talked with Wendy Farrell, former owner of the Farrelli's Cinema Supper Club, which closed two years ago. Farrell said that even with dinner, the two-screen theater was unable to compete with a nearby Harkins.

#### Phoenix Ranks Third in U.S. with 1MSF Net Office Space Absorption

Compiled by Cassidy Turley Metro Phoenix is third in the nation for office demand during the third quarter with more than 1 MSF of net absorption.

- Metro Phoenix ranked 3rd in the Nation for overall office demand during the last quarter with net absorption of 1,008,933 SF. The only two markets that were higher were Houston with 1.7MSF and New York with 1.3MSF of net absorption.
- Net absorption during the 3rd quarter was the second largest quarterly gain since 2006.
- Two speculative office buildings started

construction during the third quarter: SkySong III, approximately 75% preleased and Park Place Central, 1360 S. Spectrum Blvd., Chandler.

Since the end of the "Great Recession," metro Phoenix office market has experienced lackluster growth. Average annual net absorption for 2011 and 2012 was 1.2MSF. To draw a parallel to the 2001 recession, demand for office space in Phoenix was weak in the first three years of the recovery (averaging 1.7MSF of annual net absorption), and then the office sector took off in 2005, 2006, 2007 (averaging 2.8MSF of annual net absorption). Metro Phoenix office market is starting to reach similar years to 2005-2007.
