ADOT I-11 Alt. Selection & Meeting Summary Reports Available

After months of technical analysis that includes the results of public, agency and tribal input gathered earlier this year, the **Arizona Department of Transportation**, in partnership with the **Federal Highway Administration**, has published two key documents as part of the environmental study for **Interstate 11** from Nogales to Wickenburg.

The Alternatives Selection Report and 2017 Agency and Public Information Meeting Summary Report, available at <u>i11study.com/Arizona</u> under the Documents tab, reflect a year's worth of study, analysis and meetings with communities, agencies and stakeholders, and present the corridor alternatives moving forward.

The Alternatives Selection Report defines and evaluates a reasonable range of corridor options to advance to the next phase of the three-year Draft Tier 1 Environmental Impact Statement required by the National Environmental Policy Act. Ultimately, these corridor options will be assembled into end-to-end alternatives that run throughout the entire 280-mile long corridor from Nogales to Wickenburg.

The corridor options presented in the Alternatives Selection Report consider transportation performance, environmental concerns, community and economic development, and public, agency and tribal input. Moving forward, the corridor options presented in the Alternatives Selection Report will be further evaluated, and the outcomes of this analysis will be included


in the Draft Tier 1 Environmental Impact Statement that is scheduled for completion in 2018. The draft environmental document will also include a no-build alternative.

In May of this year, ADOT and the Federal Highway Administration asked the public and agencies to share their ideas, comments and concerns about the I-11 environmental study. Six public meetings, four agency meetings and five tribal meetings were held, along with a 30-day comment period. The 2017 Agency and Public Information Meeting Summary Report has helped determine ADOT's suggestions regarding corridor options as the study enters the Draft Environmental Impact Statement phase.

All comments are included in the appendices of the 2017 Agency and Public Information Meeting Summary Report, and the incorporation of comments into the decision-making process is summarized in the Alternatives Selection Report.

The next round of public involvement opportunities is scheduled to take place in late 2018, when ADOT presents the Draft Tier 1 EIS, which will consider a reasonable range of build alternatives and the no-build alternative. Public hearings will be held throughout the study corridor as part of the process. The Final Tier 1 EIS, which will include a preferred corridor alternative or the no-build option, and the Record of Decision are expected in 2019.

A future I-11 corridor would likely follow US 93 from the town of Wickenburg north to the Arizona-Nevada line. The corridor that



is the focus of the current environmental study begins in Nogales and runs north to the Tucson area, then to Casa Grande, then west of the Phoenix metropolitan area, and ends in Wickenburg.

Pima to Issue \$12M in Road Bonds

The **Pima County Board of Supervisors** has approved the issuance of \$12M in **Street and Highway Revenue Bonds** to increase roadway capacity on three major Tucson-area thoroughfares. The sale of these Revenue Bonds is part of the remaining voter-approved **1997 HURF Revenue Bond** plan.

These bonds will be used to fund capacity increases on **Broadway Boulevard**, between Euclid to Campbell avenues; **Houghton Road**, from Interstate 10 to Golf Links Road; and on **Kolb Road** between Sabino Canyon Road and Sunrise Drive, as well as several safety intersection projects.

The bonds will be paid off in 15 years using Transportation Revenue Funds.

Design of New Tucson Interchange Promotes Efficiency, Safety

It may not be immediately apparent to those using the busy interchange of Interstate 19 and Ajo Way (State Route 86), but a single set of signals will soon control traffic in a configuration designed for efficiency and safety.

I-19 and Ajo Way soon will become the **Arizona Department of Transportation**'s third single-point urban interchange in the Tucson area.

Temporary signals are in place at Ajo Way at this time. The new signals are scheduled to begin operating in January.

Created in 1974 in Clearwater, Florida, the design is often used when an interchange is being reconstructed. In a single-point urban interchange, left-turn drivers from opposite directions can move through the intersection at the same time. Among its other benefits, the design accommodates larger vehicles, including trucks and recreational vehicles, even better than traditional diamond interchanges.

This design has safety advantages as well. While the rate of collisions is about the

same, the single-point urban interchange has a lower rate of injuries and fatalities.

After crews poured the new bridge deck, the first phase of the project, which also includes widening Ajo Way and improved exit ramps at Ajo Way and Irvington Road, remains on schedule for completion in the spring. The second phase, which hasn't yet accepted bids from potential contractors,

will include widening southbound I-19, an additional transition lane for northbound traffic between Irvington and Ajo Way and improvements on Ajo Way that include a new bridge over the Santa Cruz River.

ADOT DBE Supportive Services offers One-on-One Business and Technical Assistance to certified DBE firms to assist with marketing, financial, human resources, and other technical areas. The business and technical assistance program is designed to provide DBE's with business specific training, education, and coaching to compete on federal aid projects within the heavy highway construction industry.

ADOT Bid openings after January 1st, 2017 will require prime contractors to submit DBE affidavits within 5 calendar days from bid opening. This is two days less than the current requirement. For example, if bid opens on Friday, the DBE Affidavits will be due to BECO, from the prime contractor, by Wednesday before 4:00 PM. Therefore, this is reducing the time DBEs and prime contractors have to prepare, sign and submit the DBE Affidavits to BECO. DBEs are urged to consider this new time restriction when working with prime contractors to complete and sign the DBE Affidavits in order for them to be submitted to BECO by the 5th calendar day from bid opening.

Take Steps Now for Tax Filing Season

Get ready today to file your 2017 federal income tax return. Changes for the tax filing season include ITINs, delays in refunds and validating your electronically filed return.

You May Need to Renew Your ITIN (Individual Taxpayer Identification Number)

Your ITIN may expire before you file a tax return in 2018. All ITINs not used on a federal tax return at least once in the last three years will expire on December 31, 2017. Additionally, all ITINs issued before 2013 with middle digits of 70, 71, 72 or 80 (Example: (9XX-70-XXXX) will expire at the end of the year.

Delays in Refunds for EITC and ACTC

If you claim the earned income tax credit (EITC) or the additional child tax credit (ACTC) on your tax return, the IRS must hold your refund until at least February 15 — even the portion not associated with EITC or ACTC.

Validating Your Electronically Filed Tax Return

When self-preparing your taxes and filing electronically, you must sign and validate your electronic tax return by entering your prior-year Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) or your prior-year Self-Select PIN. Using an electronic filing PIN is no longer an option.
